ANNOUNCING A NEW CONTINUING EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY:

The Advanced Intensive in Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health

This 10-month continuing education program offers professionals the opportunity to examine the optimal physical, social, emotional, and cognitive development of infant, toddlers and young children within the context of the family. The program is designed for professionals who work in the fields of psychology, counseling, social work, education, pediatrics, nursing, home visiting, early intervention, early care and education, child protection, and other allied health fields, focusing on the relationship between infants, young children and their families. The content of the Advanced Intensive builds upon the learning of the *Keeping Babies and Children in Mind: Professional Formation Series in Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health*.

The Advanced Intensive runs from October 2017 through July 2018 with two learning sessions per month - one Saturday per month at Montclair State University, and one Wednesday per month through a virtual on-line platform. Students will also be provided readings to complete in advance of each session. The cohort of Advanced Intensive students will learn advanced topics in infancy and early childhood development, emotional and relational health, assessment and intervention strategies, and systems working to support infants, children, and families in the first eight years of life. Students will also participate in monthly reflective supervision sessions with principal faculty, Dr. Gerard Costa and Kaitlin Mulcahy.

The Advanced Intensive meets all competencies in Theoretical Foundations, Law, Regulation & Policy, and Systems Expertise, and provides 24 hours of reflective supervision by an Infant Mental Health Clinical Mentor (IMH-E® IV-C) towards the New Jersey Association for Infant Mental Health Competency and Endorsement System (www.nj-aimh.org/endorsement). Continuing education units (CEU's) for Social Workers, Licensed Professional Counselors, and New Jersey teachers will be provided. Arrangements can be made for students who would like graduate course credit.

Cost for the Advanced Intensive is \$3000, payable in 10 equal installments due on the 1st of each month. A deposit of \$300 is due upon registration and will be counted towards the July 2018 payment. Cash, check or credit cards accepted.
