

Family-Based Recovery (FBR) is seeking a **Senior Parent-Child Consultant** in its treatment program for families with infants and toddlers impacted by parental substance use.

Job Responsibilities:

- provide reflective consultation to program supervisors, clinicians and support staff to ensure model fidelity;
- work closely with director and team on program development;
- collaborate on model dissemination (articles for publication related to the model and the field; workshop/conference proposals and presentations);
- lead in developing and conducting training for staff;
- conduct quarterly on-site booster training and home visits;
- conduct annual credentialing visits and report writing;
- support Level I Consultants' academic and practical learning;
- represent the program at meetings in the greater New Haven community and/or at the state level.

Requirements:

- a master's degree or higher in behavioral health, early child development or related field;
- necessary licensure per degree, if applicable;
- hold/ be in the process of obtaining the Category 4 Infant Mental Health Endorsement® (IMH Mentor) from CT-AIMH;
- minimum of ten years' experience working in the field of consultation, program development or supervision of a clinical program;
- wide-ranging knowledge of the systems that serve children and parents and of best practice in community-based family support.
